Immunogen

Peptide with sequence C-KDLREYDTAEAQ, from the internal region of the protein sequence according to NP_067090.1; NP_937850.1.

Please note the peptide is available for sale.

Purification and Storage

Purified from goat serum by ammonium sulphate precipitation followed by antigen affinity chromatography using the immunizing peptide.

Supplied at 0.5 mg/ml in Tris saline, 0.02% sodium azide, pH7.3 with 0.5% bovine serum albumin.

Aliquot and store at -20°C. Minimize freezing and thawing.

Applications Tested

Peptide ELISA: antibody detection limit dilution 1:64000.

Western blot: Approx. 37 kDa band observed in Human Brain (Cerebellum, Cerebral Cortex and Frontal Cortex) lysates (calculated MW of 38.0 kDa according to NP_937850.1) An additional band of unknown identity was also consistently observed at 85 kDa. This band was successfully blocked by incubation with the immunising peptide. Recommended concentration: 1-3µg/ml. Primary incubation 1 hour at room temperature.

Species Reactivity

Tested: Human Expected from sequence similarity: Human, Mouse, Pig, Cow EB08822 (1µg/ml) staining of Frontal Cortex lysate (35µg protein in RIPA buffer). Detected by chemiluminescence.
